JUSTIFICATION

In the context of modern challenges caused by full-scale armed aggression against Ukraine, there is a growing need to train not only high-level specialists, but also responsible citizens who are ready to protect national security, law and order, and human rights. That is why the introduction of Basic Combined Military Training (BCMT) into the educational and professional program for bachelors in the specialty 293.00.01 "International Law" is a logical and socially significant step.

The integration of BCMT into the educational process corresponds to the state strategy for national-patriotic education, security policy and today's requirements for the formation of a defensible society (Law of Ukraine "On the Fundamentals of National Resistance", Law of Ukraine "On Military Duty and Military Service", Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine dated 06/21/2024 No. 734 "On Approval of the Procedure for Conducting Basic Military Training of Citizens of Ukraine Obtaining Higher Education and Police Officers", Letter of the Ministry of Education and Science No. 1/4893-25 dated 03/14/2025 "On the Introduction of Basic Training of Education Seekers").

In this regard, in accordance with the requirements of the current legislation of Ukraine, basic combined-arms training has been integrated into the structure of the educational and professional program for training bachelors in specialty 293 "International Law", which provides for the acquisition by applicants of initial military knowledge, the formation of self-organization skills, discipline, teamwork and responsibility - as important components of professional and civic maturity, in particular, relevant changes have been made to:
