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## **JUSTIFICATION**

The educational program 1.D9.00.01 International Law was created to continue the implementation of the educational program 293.00.01 International Law in accordance with the List of branches of knowledge and specialties in which higher education applicants are trained, approved by the Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine dated 04/29/2015 No. 266 (as amended by the Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine dated 08/30/2024 No. 1021, as amended by the Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine dated 02/21/2025 No. 188) and the Order of the Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine dated 11/19/2024 No. 1625, registered with the Ministry of Justice of Ukraine on 12/03/2024 under No. 1833/43178, and in accordance with the decision of the Academic Council of Borys Grinchenko Kyiv Metropolitan University dated 02/27/2025, minutes No. 2.

New edition of the educational and professional program 293.00.01 "International Law", approved by the decision of the Academic Council of Borys Grinchenko Kyiv Metropolitan University dated 06/20/24, protocol No. \_ . The adoption of the new edition of the educational and professional program is due to the need to bring the educational and professional program into line with the state Standard and take into account the recommendations of experts and the GER NAZYAVO made during the accreditation in 2023.

During the implementation of the educational and professional program 293.00.01 "International Law" (2021 - 2023) and based on the proposals of the scientific and pedagogical staff of the Department of International Law, European and Euro-Atlantic Integration, applicants, heads of practice bases, the Employers' Council of the Faculty of Law and in connection with the approval of the State Standard for the specialty 293 International Law, the educational program was revised and changes were made to its content.

These changes led to the development of a new version of the description of the educational and professional program.

## 1. Appendix 1 – ELECTIVE PART OF THE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

### *"Legal Regulation of International Economic Relations"*

The elective block "Legal Regulation of International Economic Relations" is aimed at deepening general and professional competencies within the framework of specialty 293 "International Law" and this educational program through: studying the branches of international law that regulate international economic relations (financial, customs, environmental, investment) and national law of Ukraine; forming in applicants a holistic idea of \u200b\u200bways to resolve foreign economic disputes, the ability to resolve foreign economic disputes and represent subjects of foreign economic relations in the process of considering foreign economic disputes through litigation and arbitration.

A logically constructed block of elective components is offered for study, which is simultaneously aimed at deepening program competencies within the framework of the selected educational program and forming additional ones. The block is selected at the end of the first year of study. Each semester, students have forms of control over various components of this block, and are also provided with a choice of academic disciplines from the Course Catalog, taking into account their own needs and interests.
